On August 4, 2006, RedDot's parent company - Hummingbird and Open Text announced that they have reached an agreement whereby Open Text will acquire Hummingbird in a transaction valued at approximately US\$489 million, or US \$27.85 per share. Subject to the receipt of shareholder and other approvals, we expect the deal will close in early October.

Once the transaction is complete, the combined entity will be the largest independent global ECM vendor, and will be able to serve your ECM needs with a much broader portfolio of products and solutions.
